Christ is Risen, He is risen indeed!

What do you do in light of this good news?

On that 1st Easter evening, some of the disciples gathered together behind locked doors for fear of the world outside. The Risen Christ met them there, in the midst of their fear and uncertainty, and gave them specific instructions for Easter living.

John 20:19-22 tells us "Jesus came and stood among them and said 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he said this, he breathed on them and said 'receive the Holy Spirit....'"

Jesus breathed a Spirit of peace and courage into his fear-filled friends and sent them out to tell others the good news about the God of Resurrection. That's our job too! Easter sends us out to live joyfully and boldly as disciples of the Risen Christ.

On that first Easter morning, after Mary Magdalene encountered Jesus in the garden, her simple testimony was "I have seen the Lord." When Jesus' disciples reported to Thomas their Easter experience in the locked room, they say "we have seen the Lord."

With these disciples we too are sent out to tell others "we have seen the Lord!" (Remember, when we have seen life-giving love in action, we too can say "we have seen the Lord!")

We are sent out to share the Spirit of life and love and peace we have received from Jesus.

We are sent out to meet the Risen One who goes ahead of us to surprise and bless us on the way.

Easter then, is not just a day set aside for coming together in celebration. Easter is the experience of seeing the Risen One, receiving His Spirit, and being sent in His name. We are sent people! Marked with the cross of Christ from the waters of baptism, we are marked for Easter living!



Annual Report Addendum

A revision to the Account Balance page in the 2023 Annual Report has been printed and is available in the Rose Parlor. The account balances reflected in the report booklet were incorrectly dated as end of the year when they were actually from the end of November. The Revised page of account balances is correct for 12/31/23.



Sanctuary Heating System

We continue to wait for a 3rd quote for replacement of the steam boiler serving the sanctuary and meeting space. The 2 quotes previously received range from \$43,000 to \$53,000 and include different specifications. At this point in time, those who have reviewed the proposals have greater confidence in the higher proposal. Once we have received and reviewed the third proposal, a recommendation will be made to the council. The

council, in consultation with the finance committee, will be looking at options for financing. As required by our constitution, the council will call a congregational meeting to seek approval for moving ahead with the boiler replacement once we have all the information needed.

Remember: All 2024 contributions designated for the Capital Campaign will be used to help fund this project.

Learning to Ask God Questions

From Pastor Kate: I am currently reading a couple of books addressing the challenges faced by the church in the 21st century. The following commentary is an excerpt from <u>Leading Faithful Innovation</u>: Following God into a Hopeful Future. Your thoughts in response are welcome!

[In looking at our past, and considering the future], we usually hear what may be called "church questions." These are questions like, How can we get more people to join our church? How can our church meet a need in the neighborhood? How can we attract more young families? These questions are understandable, arising from genuine concern for the church and for our neighbors. However, they tend to default toward a posture of fixing the church. Our focus becomes centered on what we can do to sustain or grow the church as an institution. God's role tends to drop out of view.

Moreover, our neighbors can easily become abstractions ("young families," "the needy") rather than actual people with whom we have relationships and whose stories we know. We can turn them into objects of attraction or fixing according to our visions and plans for them. We can lose sight of our neighbors as people among whom God is already at work.

[One of the great challenges we face is] to change the questions we ask from "church questions" to "God questions." God questions can't be answered through strategic plans and managerial solutions. They require a different posture of listening, discernment (paying attention to God), experimentation, and reflection in community. They draw us closer to God and our neighbors—not as objects but as particular people with unique stories, yearnings, and dreams.

"God questions" ask, What might God be up to in the lives of our neighbors? Where has God been present in the history of our congregation? How might the Spirit be moving in the lives of our church's members or calling us to join God's work in the neighborhood?

We believe that the church's future is waiting to be discovered not inside the walls of church buildings or in committee meetings but on journeys into the neighborhood [where we have been sent by Jesus]. The social and cultural shifts that are eroding established church structures are too big for any of us to reverse. Trying to "fix" the church will not get us very far and will instead distract us from the deeper work at hand. We need a very different kind of imagination, approach, and set of practices.

members of the Philadelphia Eagles football team, this charity has grown in 50 years to include 380 campuses in 48 countries! The RMH in Ronald McDonald Hershey was founded in 1984 and from its beginning of House Charities

having 8 rooms to provide for parents of children being


