On the night he was betrayed, Jesus went with his disciples "to a place called Gethsemane... and he said '.... I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here and keep awake [while I pray]." Three times Jesus returned to check in with his disciples and three times he found them sleeping. He said: "Could you not keep awake one hour? Keep awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." (Mark 14:32-42)

On that night in the garden of Gethsemane, the disciples were so utterly human: unable to pay attention, unable to tune into Jesus' fear and foreboding, unable to persevere in prayer for him and with him. The spirit is willing but the flesh is weak indeed!

One of the things I appreciate about Lent and Holy Week is the way the story tells deep truths about who we are and how hard it is to pay proper attention to Jesus. We grow weary, we become distracted, we fall asleep. In the arc of Jesus' life and ministry, it was so much easier to follow him when he was working miracles and surrounded by adoring crowds. There is a certain irony to the fact that the week we call Holy is the very week the disciples fell short, fell asleep, and ran away.

Lent and Holy Week remind us that God knows the truth about us and loves us anyway! "For while we were still weak, at the right time, Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person – though perhaps for a good person someone might actually die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:6-8)

What wonderous love is this?... the old hymn asks. This is the life giving, death defeating power of God's love revealed in the crucified and risen Christ!

Lent and Holy Week give us opportunities for being honest about ourselves and for keeping our hearts centered in God's wonderous love. Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday provide worship touchstones to help us stay awake and stay attuned to the surprising ways God works to bring about healing and salvation (hint: there is a cross and a tomb involved). We are deep into the 40 days of Lent and thanks be to God, Easter is coming. How will you keep awake and be a part of the story of this Holy Week?

Holy Week Schedule



Holy Week and Easter

The Way to Easter is by Way of the Cross. Worship during Holy Week is meant to help us on the way. Beginning on Palm Sunday, continuing on to Maundy Thursday and into Good Friday, we journey with Jesus as he writes a new, cross shaped covenant on our hearts.

March 24, Palm/Passion Sunday 9:15am worship with blessing of the palms and holy communion

Holy Week begins with "all glory, laud and honor," as Jesus enters Jerusalem and the crowds shout Hosanna! The joyous acclamation and the waving of palms soon give way to shouts of condemnation as Jesus is arrested and sentenced to death. In our worship for this day we will remember the events of holy week according to the gospel of Mark.

March 28, Maundy Thursday at 7pm

"On the night he was betrayed," the community of Jesus' disciples shared a meal together. As the season of Lent comes to an end this night, we too will share a holy meal "in remembrance of Him." Maundy Thursday commemorates the new commandment ("mandatum") to love one another as Jesus loves us. Our worship ends with the stripping of the altar and a silent dismissal as we prepare to see the face of love on the cross on Good Friday.

March 29, Good Friday at Noon: The Way of the Cross


We meet on this Good Friday to travel the Way of the Cross and to contemplate the passion and death of Jesus. Good Friday worship is intended to offer a time for prayerful reflection on Jesus' passion (ie, suffering), in order to deepen the joy and wonder of Easter.

The Manheim Ministerial Association will host an afternoon Good Friday service of worship on Friday, March 29th, at Pleasant View Communities, Hoffer Auditorium at 2:00pm. This worship includes area pastors and will focus on Jesus' last words from the cross.

March 31 at 9:15am. Easter Sunday

Christ is risen, and we gather together to offer our worship and praise for God's surprising and life-giving power! Christ is risen, and we have been set free from the bonds of death. Christ is risen, and we are forgiven. Christ is risen, and like the women at the tomb we are amazed. Let us rejoice. Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Bible Study


Continuing through March, the Sunday morning Bible study is exploring First and Second Samuel. These 2 books are foundational for understanding the history of Israel and Israel's expectations about a messiah. First and Second Samuel tell the story of an important leadership transition for Israel and introduce the roles that will dominate Israel's leadership going forward—the roles of prophet and king. As Israel grew and developed as a nation, their well-being depended on their willingness to respond to God's faithfulness, recognizing God as their ultimate ruler and king. Faithfulness to God and God's kingdom (before the kingdoms of this world!) continue to be our struggle even today.

All are welcome as we meet together following worship and explore God's word.

Sanctuary Heating System

To date we have received one bid for replacement of the steam boiler serving the sanctuary and meeting space, and we continue to wait for a response from one other company. Not many companies work with commercial steam boilers so our options have been limited. The work also entails extensive welding and repairs on the piping system, so that has been another factor in calculating the costs involved.

All 2024 contributions designated for the Capital Campaign will be used to help fund this project.

Souper Bowl Challenge Results

This year's Souper Bowl Challenge was given by the Manheim Ministerial Association to gather 5,000 cans of soup amongst the local church families to supplement the Manheim Central Food Pantry's needs. Zion was able to



contribute 259 cans of soup, beef stew, and chili towards the total accumulated. So far, the Ministerium collected 1,819 cans. What a blessing! We certainly live in a giving community!

It was amazing to see all of their creations in one space.

Gift Card Collection for "The Home on Ferdinand" continues through March 17th!

In our January meeting, we had the privilege of hearing from board members of the Manheim Community Life Program. This organization purchased, and is now responsible for, the operation of the transitional facility known as the "Home on Ferdinand". Since 2021, the "Home" has not only provided a temporary home for women and children, but also has aided in counseling and training in life-skills to help women get back on the road to self-sufficiency. This is definitely not a "free ride" when these women and their kids get accepted as residents in the "Home". They are responsible for their own meals, doing their own laundry, keeping the facility clean, holding down jobs, even maintaining a vehicle if they need it to get back and forth to a job.

So, what we'd like to do is provide some assistance to these women and kids who have gone through some pretty tough times. For the next few weeks, the Daughters are sponsoring a collection of "gift cards" for the families currently residing at the Home. They can be purchased for anywhere...Weis Markets, Grocery Outlet, Target, Walmart, Sheetz, even gift cards from any of Manheim's pizza shops...(pizza's a great "community" meal!) You'll find a collection box for the gift cards on the small table in the Rose Parlor. The amounts can be anywhere from \$10-\$25. We all know how expensive it is to buy groceries, clothing, gas, or even just a roll of paper towels. These gift cards will enable each woman to purchase what they need for their specific situations. Thank you in advance for making these women and children feel the love and support of their friends at Zion Lutheran.

The organization is still looking for a small group of 6-7 "neighboring volunteers" from local churches to provide a support and mentoring team. Bridge of Hope provides case management, financial assistance, budget coaching and accountability, but depends on church volunteers to help make the family feel loved and cared for.
